## G7 Bars Statement on the situation in Afghanistan

Deeply concerned about the situation in Afghanistan and about the fate of all Afghans -particularly women, those working in the justice sector, and human rights defenders;

- 1. **REAFFIRM** our commitment to the right to asylum, as well as the right for Afghans to leave their country, and travel to another, safely;
- 2. **MANIFEST** our solidarity with the people of Afghanistan, those who are working in the legal community and all those who fight for the rule of law and justice in Afghanistan;
- 3. **URGE** our respective governments to ensure the safety of all human rights defenders and in particular of Afghan women judges and lawyers.
